Located on the southeast side of the San Francisco Bay, Fremont is a city of over 208,000 people with an area of 92 square miles, making it the fourth most populous city in the Bay Area and California's fifth largest city in area. With its moderate climate and its proximity to major universities, shopping areas, recreational and cultural activities, employment centers, major airports, and the Bay Area Rapid Transit system, Fremont captures metropolitan living at its best.

The Fremont area was first settled with the establishment of Mission San Jose by the Spanish. In the mid-1840's, John C. Fremont mapped a trail through Mission Pass to provide access for American settlers into the southeastern San Francisco Bay Area. In 1853, Washington Township was established, taking in the communities of Mission San Jose, Centerville, Niles, Irvington, and Warm Springs. On January 23, 1956, these communities joined together to form the City of Fremont.

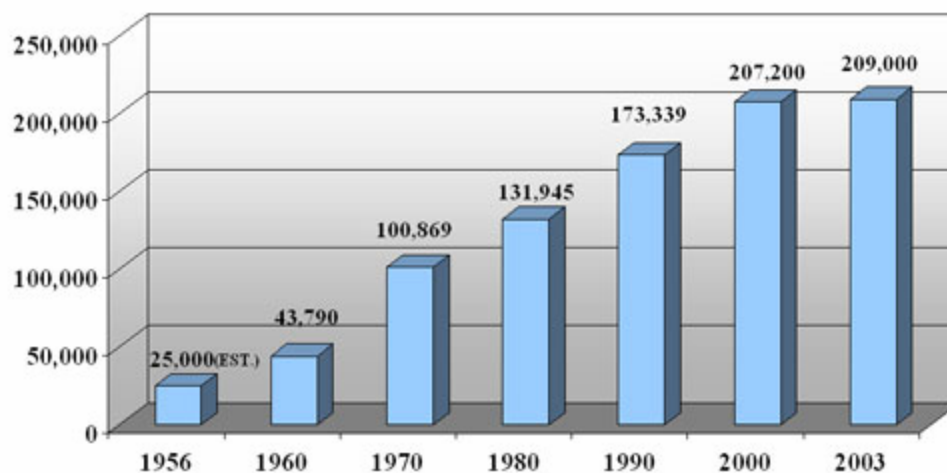

Fremont Park offers a challenging but fun round of golf for the beginner to scratch golfer. Central Park and Lake Elizabeth run along one side with the Fremont hills lining the other. Spacious environmental areas and large lakes hug fairways and guard greens leading to some very interesting shots.

Depending on which tees you play from, the six par fours average approximately 320 yards. The remaining three holes, one approximately 175 yards, the other two about 80 yards, are all par three. From the black tees: Slope 31.5/Rating 113 (9 holes).

When Do I Need to License My Pet?

City Ordinance requires cats and dogs to be licensed. Pet owners need to get a license within 30 days of:

- Acquiring a cat or dog that is over four months old
- A cat or dog turning four months old
- Moving to Fremont with a cat or dog
- The expiration of a pet license

There is a \$10 penalty charged if cats and dogs are not licensed within these timeframes.

How do I get a pet license?

Owners can get a pet license at the Tri-City Animal Shelter at 1950 Stevenson Boulevard on Monday through Friday from 9:00am - 12:00pm, and 1:30pm - 4:00pm. The Shelter is closed on Saturday and Sunday. You will need to bring a current rabies certificate, but you do **not** need to bring your pet.

Rapid Transit

The extension will begin at the new Warm Spring station (in Fremont), which will be under construction by 2004. Once built, the extension will be the connecting link between Santa Clara County and the current BART system. The Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) provides dependable rapid transit access to much of the Bay Area. BART currently has its southernmost station in central Fremont and is working with the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) to expand the BART system into the cities of Milpitas, San Jose, and Santa Clara.

Rail

The Centerville Train Station, in Fremont, services the Altamont Commuter Express (ACE) and the Amtrak "Capitol Corridor" train lines. The Amtrak "Capitol Corridor" train line links Fremont to both Sacramento to the north and San Jose to the south. The Altamont Commuter Express (ACE) train line travels from San Joaquin County to Santa Clara. Freight needs are served by Union Pacific rail lines
